THE STORY OF CLOUDS

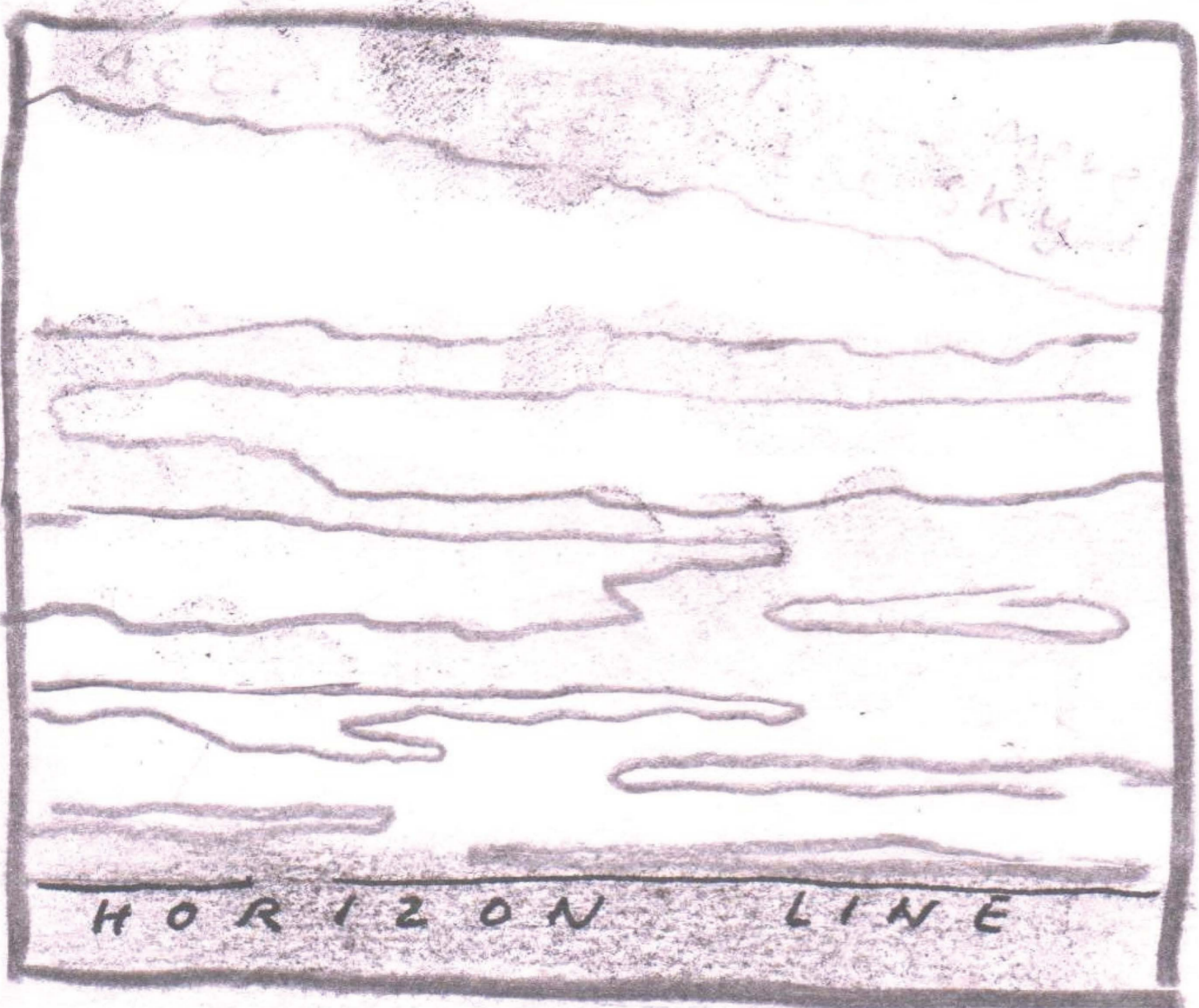

Here are 4 examples of clouds, there are many more so look to the sky and draw what you see...

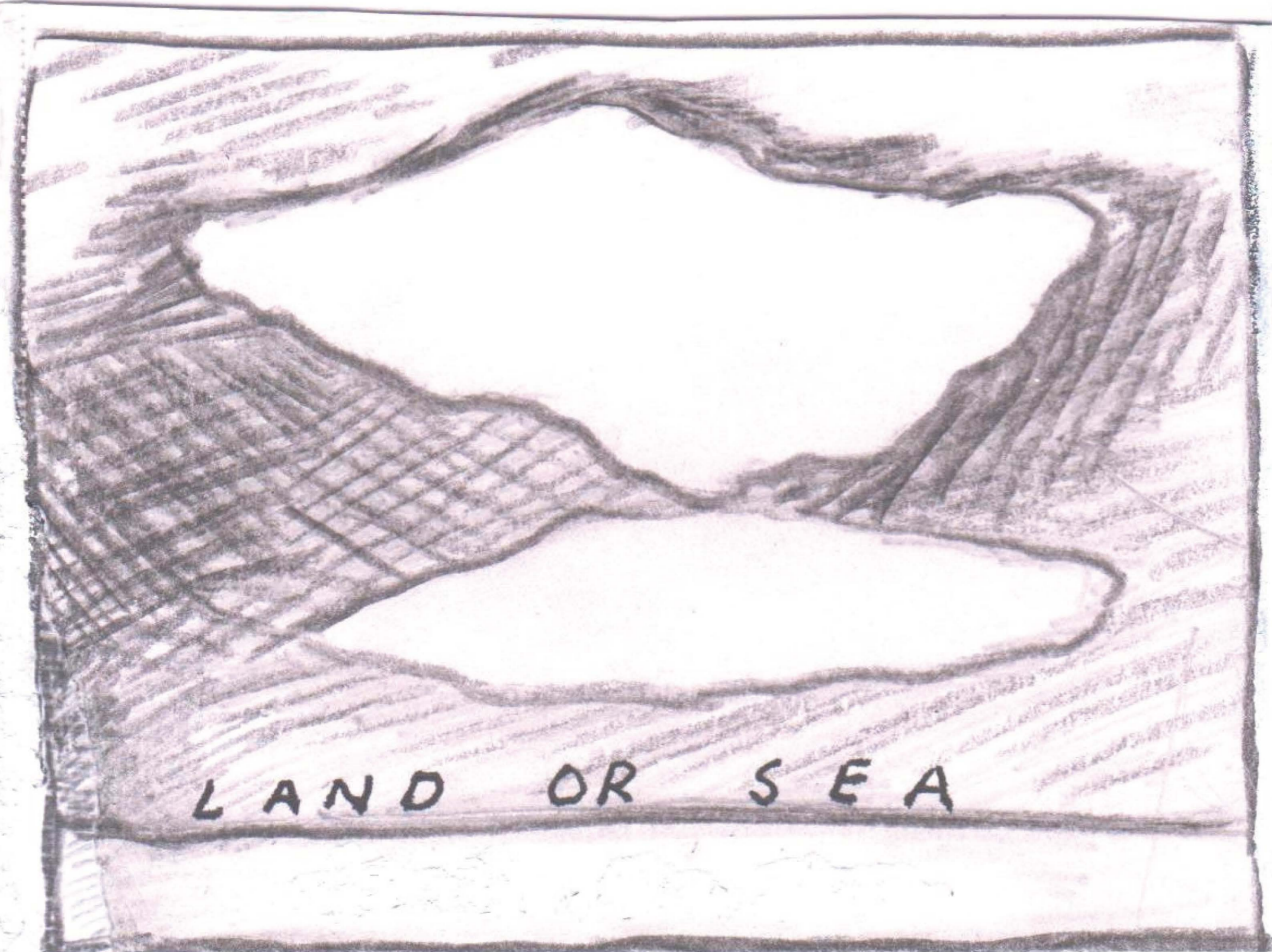
Draw the shapes around the clouds



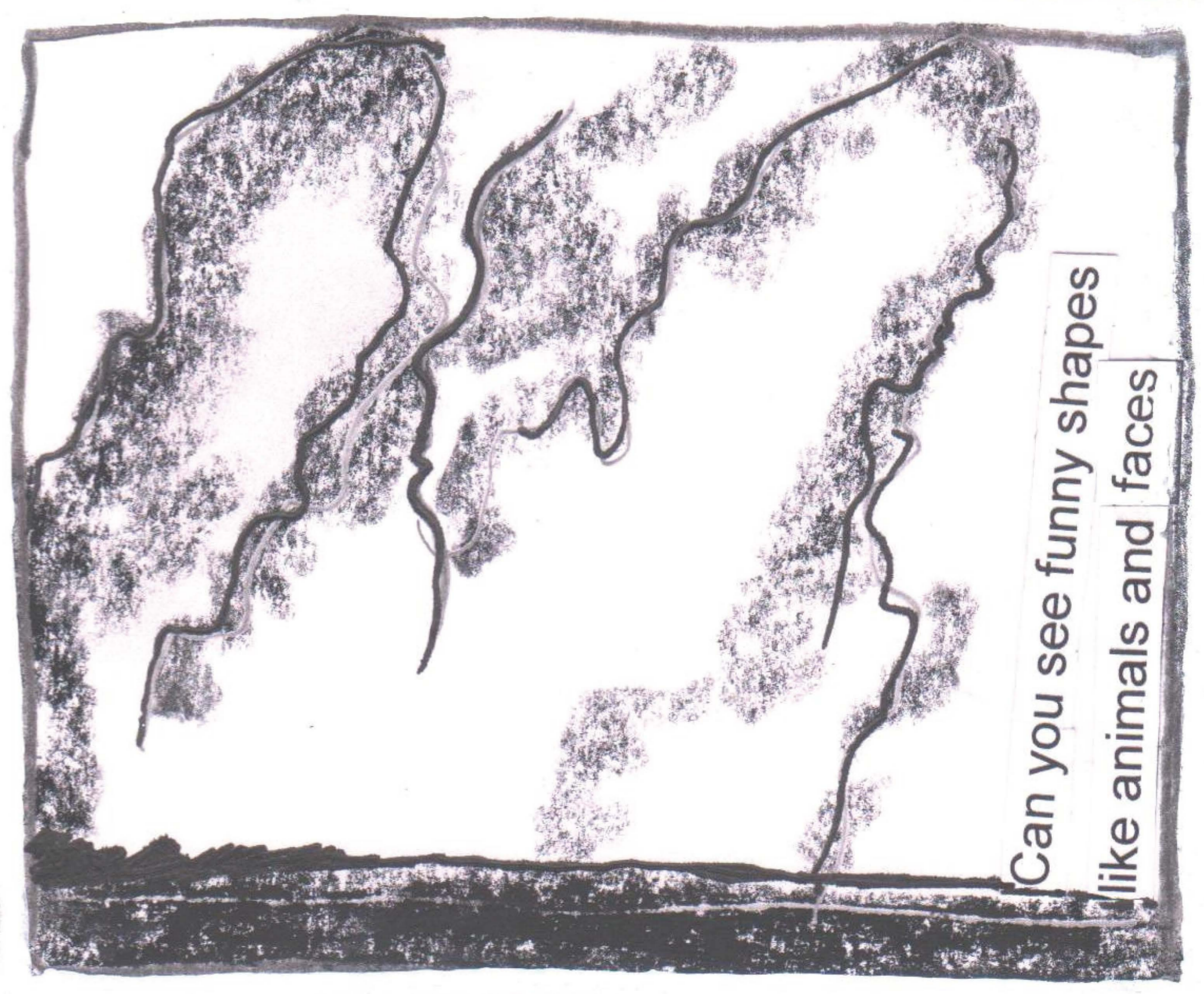
1. Stratocumulus Clouds – parallel layers



2. Nimbostratus Clouds – dark grey raincloud



3. The Anvil Cloud – light breaks through the rain
