

Finger Bugs

This activity is all about creating your own Fleetwood Finger Bugs

There are many different types of butterflies found on Fleetwood dunes, Small Copper, Large White, Small White, Red Admiral, Painted Lady and the Small Blue



Did you know???

Many species of butterfly only lay their eggs on wildflowers so maybe try our Wildflower Bomb Workshop



Here's how to make Finger Bugs:

1

Cut out a circle from white or coloured paper to make the body of your bug

2

Then cut a smaller circle for the head and stick it to the back of the body

3

Now you can cut out things like legs, antenna, wings, etc. and stick them onto your bug using glue or sticky tape

4

You can decorate your bug, adding patterns with felt tip pens, coloured pencils, crayons, stickers, glitter, anything you like



5

To make your bug a Finger Bug take a small strip of paper, loosely wrap it around your finger and sellotape the end down so it doesn't unravel. Then sellotape the paper ring to the back of your bug and it's ready to wear on your finger!

You can make bugs in lots of different shapes, sizes and colours, let your imagination go wild!
