The Mount Gardens are a perfect place to make Land Art as there is such a wide variety of trees & plants but you can make it anywhere, your own garden, the beach, the park or just out on a walk



Did you know???

There are 4,300 flowering bulbs planted in the Mount Gardens, including a wide variety of daffodils



Here's how to make your Land Art:

1

Find yourself a bag or box to collect your materials then head outside to hunt for things like; leaves, twigs, pinecones, pebbles, shells, grasses, petals, anything from nature that interests you. Collect plenty but please don't pull anything living from trees or plants

2

Find a spot where you want to make your artwork, The Mount Gardens, in your garden, on the beach, in the park on a wall etc.

3

Get all the materials you've collected out of your bag and lay them on the floor, start to play around making patterns with them. You could make circles, spirals, towers of pebbles, a winding trail for people to follow, whatever you want, just let your imagination take over!



4

You can make your art just using one type of material such as pebbles or leaves or a mixture of lots of different things.

Leave your finished work where you made it for other people to discover and enjoy. You could take a photo or do a drawing of your artwork as it will probably get blown or washed away



5

You could try making a different artwork for each of the four seasons Check out artist Andy Goldsworthy on the internet for more inspiration
