



Coastal Collage



This activity is all about creating your own beach inspired collage

There are lots of great places in Fleetwood to experiment with this idea, the beach is the perfect, The Mount Gardens, your garden, the park, at school or even in your house



Did you know???

The rock armour on the Rossall Coastal Defence Scheme is made up of about 50,000 huge boulders!



Here's how to make your Coastal Collage:

1

To make your collages you will need some thin paper (printer paper is good) and some coloured crayons then head to the beach or wherever you want to explore

2

Once you get to your chosen location, start looking for some interesting surfaces such as rocks, concrete, shells, paths, wood, railings etc.

3

Next place your paper on top of one of the surfaces and start rubbing your crayon over the top of your paper. You will start to see a picture of the surface you are taking a rubbing of. Experiment by rubbing the crayon gently and then harder to see the difference.

Repeat the process on lots of different surfaces until you have a nice collection of rubbings

4

Once you have all your rubbings take them home and carefully cut them into different shapes and sizes.

Finally, glue your shapes onto a piece of coloured card or paper and there is your finished coastal collage!
