

Wildflower Bombs

This activity is all about making your own wildflower seed bombs to plant in Fleetwood

Wildflowers provide food for pollinating insects and they absorb pollution from the air

Did you know???

The Mount Gardens is planning it's own wildflower garden! See if you can find it this summer

Here's how to make your Wildflower Bombs:

1

Collect a pile of scrap paper, the paler in colour the better and avoid any shiny paper such as magazines

3

Next add a small handful of wildflower seeds into the pulp and gently mix

5

Then fill small silicone moulds with the pulp or shape into small balls and leave to dry. You can also add a few drops of food colouring on the top of your bombs

2

Rip up your scrap paper into small pieces, cover with water and leave for about 8 hours or overnight.

Then use your fingers to pull it apart, keep going to you have mushy pulp a bit like porridge!

Then scoop handfuls of the pulp & seeds into an old tea towel or t-shirt and squeeze as much water out as possible

Plant your bombs sometime during March & April
